Loss of USDA Foods

2019-2020 and 2020-2021 School Years

TDA analyzed the cause of all losses that occurred at National School Lunch Program (NSLP) state-contracted warehouses in the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years. The analysis showed most losses were due to contracting entities not ordering product, causing it to expire while in storage.

2019-2020 Expired Items





How can I help reduce the loss of USDA Foods entitlement and commodities due to expiration?

Review your Farm to School (FTS) surveys and add to your calendar.

- o FTS items are delivered and allocated exactly as requested.
- o Pre-allocations occur on Tuesday before your delivery date.

Closely monitor new allocations – Tuesdays and Thursdays.

- o Email notices are sent out to CEs with new allocations.
- o Place all new allocations on your next available order.

Monitor your Weekly Commodity Bulletin at least monthly.

- o Track unordered allocations as they remain in storage
- Check for items under Long Term Storage these have been allocated for 6 months. <u>Note</u>: USDA recommends commodities should not stay in storage longer than 6 months.

Notify your ESC representative of allocations you can't use.
