### **Noncongregate Extreme Heat Waiver**

- Sites are outdoors and exposed to the weather.
- No alternative, temperature-controlled locations at which to provide congregate summer service.
- The National Weather Service (NWS) has issued a Heat Advisory, Excessive Heat Warning, or Excessive Heat Watch for the area.

### **Noncongregate Extreme Heat Waiver**

- One request form per day (multiple sites can be submitted per form)
- Must be grab-n-go and served directly to children DAILY.
  - Parent pick-up NOT allowed.
  - Multi-day bundling NOT allowed.
- Do **not** need to indicate intent to participate in the site applications.

- Extra \$0.40 per lunch and \$.15 provided by the Keep Kids Fed Act expired June 30, 2023.
- New rates reflect an adjustment to the base rate from Program Year (SY) 2022–2023.





### **End of COVID-19 Flexibilities**

Ended June 30:

- Offsite monitoring waivers
  - For allowable offsite flexibilities and strategies: https://www.fns.usda.gov/cn/oversight-monitoring-onsite-offisiteschool-meals-programs
- Fiscal action flexibility for supply chain disruptions
- Keep Kids Fed Act (KKFA) higher reimbursements
- Non-congregate waivers in the event of a COVID outbreak.
