NEW! Child Nutrition Program Integrity Final Rule

USDA's Food and Nutrition Service published a final rule on program integrity to ensure that child nutrition programs are properly operated and managed to protect federal funds and taxpayer dollars. The final rule impacts regulations for the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, Special Milk Program, Summer Food Service Program, and Child and Adult Care Food Program. Attachment B Uploads due October 31, 2023

CEs must complete the Attachment B Upload module in TX-UNPS no later than October 31, 2023. CEs must upload their application, application instructions, and template

notification letters to the Attachment B Upload module.

CEs that operate standard counting and claiming, including universal free meals, Provision 2 in the base year, and Residential Child Care Institutions (RCCIs) with day students must complete the Attachment B Upload module in TX-UNPS. CEs will answer a question and upload the template school meal application, application instructions, and template eligibility notification letters used by your district.

FSMC Contract Timelines


September 1, 2023: RFP and renewal process opened

December 1, 2023: All new contracts (RFP) must be submitted to TDA for approval to publish.

February 1, 2024: Renewal documents must be submitted to TDA for approval.

April 1, 2024: New contract selections must be submitted to TDA for approval to award/execute.

June 21, 2024: New contracts and renewals must be signed/executed and submitted to TDA

Policy Updates

Self-Certification Option to Increase Micro-Purchase

Threshold

Beginning SY23-24, approved CEs participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) may self-certify a micro-purchase threshold of up to \$49,999.99. CEs may complete the self-certification process August 1st - October 31st of each year by submitting the SmartSheet form posted here. All information is required during submission and will be verified during an Administrative Review. If the submitted information is not accurate, a finding will be issued, and fiscal action will apply. Upon approval, the CE must update applicable procurement procedures.

Pre-Award Civil Rights Compliance Review Form Revised

A revised Pre-Award Civil Rights Compliance Review Form has been posted and released. This was a minor update to reflect language in FNS Instruction 113-1 about Civil Rights compliance reviews within the two years prior to program application. Multiple ARM Sections Updated

Guidance changes and clarifications were made to the following:

- Section 4, Eligibility Determination

 Additionally, on August 21, an updated Section 19 of the ARM (as well as a new
 complete ARM) was released on SquareMeals. When previously released on

August 4, a glitch occurred during the conversion of the Word content to PDF, leading to the omission of some content. Section 19 was the only section affected.

USDA Foods Updates

TX-UNPS Ordering Round Update

Many schools have noticed several changes to their entitlement balances shown in the Weekly Commodity Bulletin. This is for two reasons:

- 1) As communicated earlier TDA has applied the new rate of assistance which resulted in less entitlement vs what was projected in the March ordering round. Schools will see that their initial entitlement balance has lowered due to this change.
- 2) TDA has updated all processing surveys in TX-UNPS to reflect what was charged against ordering for the School Year 24. Due to the significant carryover balance with processors, schools received a portion of their requests from the State Account. This means that you will see an increase in your processing reserved.

At this time, TDA has ordered all Processing Diversions for the state of Texas using analysis of usage vs demand from the schools and processors. TX-UNPS is now open for an additional opportunity to realize entitlement value through Direct Delivery (Brown Box) into your region's state contracted warehouse. Please transfer your remaining entitlement balances from Processing Reserved so that you may utilize the current open surveys to request additional Direct Delivery USDA commodities.
