Reduced Price Breakfasts Now Free Background

- ✓ The budget approved by the 88th Texas Legislature includes funding that lets students who are approved to get reduced-price meals get breakfast free
- ✓ Students that meet income requirements for reduced price meals must be offered breakfast at no charge by Texas school districts that participate in the School Breakfast Program.



- ✓ Currently, August breakfasts would need to be charged the reduced-price
- ✓ TDA exploring other funding options
- ✓ School GR could be used to cover the cost of August reduced breakfasts






School Responsibilities

- ✓ Communicate the benefit change for reduced price students to parents. This includes making changes to the Eligibility and Determination letter sent to parents.
- ✓ Ensure POS and other methods of charging students of meals are updated to ensure reduced price students are no longer charged.
- ✓ Enter monthly claims in TXUNPS, including the number of reduced-price breakfasts served.

Reduced Price Breakfasts Now Free Claiming Process

- ✓ Schools should continue to process monthly claims in TXUNPS as normal
- ✓ Schools can search for payments on the Comptroller website, if needed.
- ✓ Schools can expect 2 payments for school meal reimbursements starting next year
 - ✓ Federal reimbursement for free, reduced, and paid meals
 - ✓ No change in frequency/timing
 - ✓ General revenue reimbursement for reduced price breakfasts
 - ✓ Estimated receipt 60 days after claims are submitted to TDA
