

Project Update



What is TANS?

The Texas Automated Nutrition System or TANS is a web-based platform designed to facilitate the administration and oversight of USDA nutrition programs. TANS will serve the same role in daily program operations that TX-UNPS has played for nearly a decade.

Sponsoring organizations will use TANS to submit program and site applications, submit claims for reimbursement, participate in compliance reviews, complete required reports, and more.

State users will play the counterpart to each of these processes through the careful review and approval of the information submitted by organizations.

Will we have TANS soon?

TANS is being rolled out by program, so when you have access to TANS depends on what programs your organization operates.

When will I get access to TANS?

You will gain access to TANS shortly ahead of the launch of the first program their organization operates.

For example, organizations operating both NSLP and CACFP can expect to receive login details the same week NSLP goes live in April. They will use the same accounts when CACFP goes live in July.













What can I expect during initial user set up in TANS?

For their initial program launch, all active TX-UNPS users associated with the organization will be migrated and set up by TDA in TANS.

New TANS users will be assigned equivalent security roles.

During set up, users will receive 2 emails:

- Email 1 contains your username (same as TX-UNPS username)
- Email 2 contains your temporary password

A new password must be set to successfully log in.

Are users' security roles separated by program?

No, TANS does not assign security access based on program. Instead, security roles are function-based.

For example, a user with the "ORG Application" security role has access to create, edit, submit, and revise applications for any programs their organization is approved to operate.

Will FSMC representatives be granted access to TANS?

Yes, FSMC representatives can be granted view-only access to TANS. They will not have the ability to create, modify, submit, or take any other actions in the system.





Will my organization or site IDs change?

Organization IDs (formerly CE ID) will not change. Organizations active in TX-UNPS at the time of the transition will have their Organization ID migrated over, so they will see no change to their Organization ID.

For organizations that had no active profile in TX-UNPS at the time of the transition, new Organization IDs will be assigned. These new TANS Organization IDs will be 5-digit IDs beginning with a 1.

Will my organization or site IDs change?

Organization IDs (formerly CE ID) will not change. Organizations active in TX-UNPS at the time of the transition will have their Organization ID migrated over, so they will see no change to their Organization ID.

For organizations that had no active profile in TX-UNPS at the time of the transition, new Organization IDs will be assigned. These new TANS Organization IDs will be 5-digit IDs beginning with a 1.



Sponsors should be prepared to enter most data in the first program year. After the first year, most application data will rollover on application renewal.
