




What is a form in TANS? What's a page?

Applications or Claims are divided into forms. Each form is accessible through a menu item listed in the navigation pane or by the Next Form button at the bottom of each form. Forms receive user information by means of fields, drop-down lists, etc. A page does not receive user data but typically contains information or hyperlinks.

I've heard the terms Internal and External used to describe TANS users. What's the difference?

With respect to the TANS system, the term "Internal" refers to TDA users, and "External" refers to organization users."

In TANS, what is the difference between a warning and an error?

Warnings are displayed in yellow or blue and allow the user to proceed. Errors are displayed in red and do not allow users to proceed.

What is the difference between a button and an icon?

A button contains text and changes states when clicked. An icon is a graphic and does not change states when clicked.
