Recognition Opportunities

In cooperation with the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Chef Ann Foundation, Action for Healthy Kids is administering the Healthy Meals Incentives Initiative for rural school food authorities (SFAs) who work to improve the nutritional content and appeal of school meals. Funding Opportunities

The Newman's Own Foundation is seeking applicants for their <u>Food Justice</u> <u>for Kids Prize</u>. Applicants from school districts should have a project to help students learn about culturally relevant foods, including how they're grown, harvested, and prepared, or an idea that improves students' access to school meals, and/or a project that increases the amount of nutrition education or nutritious foods. Applications must be submitted by **June 11**.

Learning Opportunities

Summer Ag Institute

Texas Farm Bureau offers two Summer Ag Institute (SAI) sessions in June. This Continuing Professional Education opportunity gives participants real-life agricultural experience over four days. Agricultural experiences can increase enthusiasm for Farm to School programming and the use of local products in school meals. Registration is open to teachers and limited to 40 per session. Registration for both locations closes on **May 17**. The Waco SAI takes place **June 10-13**. Lubbock SAI is scheduled for **June 16-19**.

Farm Fresh Sharing

Farm Fresh Sharing spotlights Contracting Entities (CEs) from Texas and across the country who take part in farm-to-school activities. They answer questions about Farm Fresh programming and share success stories. If you are interested in being featured, please fill out this <u>survey</u>.

This month we are highlighting Culberson County-Allamoore ISD (CCAISD). Located in Van Horn (West) Texas, CCAISD is a small district that can provide free meals for all students because of the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP).

Q: How often do you serve local foods in your cafeterias?

A: Daily for both breakfast and lunch.

Q: What inspired you to start Farm Fresh programming?

A: I wanted to increase and attract food interest in school nutrition.

Q: What motivates you to continue and expand your current Farm Fresh efforts?



A: The support of my superintendent, teachers, staff, students, Congressman Tony Gonzales, and local events planner (she started the first farmers' market this summer in Van Horn), MegaCon, and my girls at Region 18. I enjoy the presentations, setting up events, and illustrating different ways to eat food items.

Q: What would you like other CEs, your students' families, and Texas producers to know about Farm Fresh Programming in school meals?

A: I come from the finance industry (bank). Money talks. In Texas, food and agriculture support an estimated 3.7 million jobs with an economic impact of

\$64.5 billion annually. Texas leads the country in job growth. Low tax rates allow businesses to invest in their workers, expand new markets, and raise incomes. Texas offers the largest transportation network. Texas products boost the Texas economy. Local school meals are nutritious, farm fresh, and taste GOOD. We are not only feeding the future generation, but teaching them to eat healthy foods, and the importance of ranching and farming. Food in their belly. Clothes on their back.

Q: How long have you been participating in Farm Fresh Programming?

A: I started participating in 2019.

Q: What has been your biggest challenge in connecting with local producers?

A: Distance and freight cost. We are located in a rural area surrounded by mountains.

Q: Do you have a specific resource to find producers in your area?

A: Yes, I use lists provided at MegaCon, Region 18, and Labatt.

Q: Do you use TDA's mapping tool on SquareMeals?

A: Yes, I do.

Q: What is your students' favorite local product that is part of a menu item?

A: Milk or chocolate milk is definitely their favorite.

Q: Do you have a garden?

A: No, we do not.

Q: How do you support your Farm Fresh programming (funding, maintenance, harvesting, volunteers to help)?

A: Funding: I use DoD, Labatt, and local as much as possible for there are no delivery fees.

Maintenance: Cafeteria staff prepare for the tasting tables or to serve on the serving line. They also do the clean-up.

Harvesting: I try to use local pecans and peppers, which are donated. We also have illustrations of local cotton, alfalfa, hay, and barley to encourage farming. Students in pre- $k - 2^{nd}$ grade have an annual trip to the pumpkin patch 160 miles away (320 miles round trip) (General Fund Expense).

Volunteers: Always reach out to those folks who are voted into their position. I have found they want to assist, appoint, or will direct you to someone. Also reach for those who serve in your community.
