Farm to School Funding Opportunities Budding Botanist Grant – A collaborative program from Kids Gardening and the Klorane

Botanical Foundation awards \$1,000 grants to schools to support youth garden

programs. Apply by October 14th. Reaching for Excellence (RFE) in Texas School Health Grant – A Texas Department of

State Health Services (DSHS) program awards grants to inspire students to live healthier lives. The program awards up to \$10,000 for school garden program development. Apply by November 14th. <u>Healthy Choices Grants</u> – The Oliver Foundation grants require a nutrition and physical

activity education component to be funded. Grants range from \$750 to \$5,000, which can fund school garden program initiatives but will not fund the construction of a garden. Apply by October 15th.


